
We will also have PE lessons from a Sports Coach through Kitteridge All Sports, and Mrs Wignall will lead our Forest School Lessons (when it's our turn!).



- Every Friday we will send home some information about the sound we have just covered and what we will be doing next week. Please practice as much as you can at home.



Fun with Jay


Kit and Sam have used their magic book to bring Jay, the alien, to visit. Read all about their exciting adventure at school!

Reading

- Reading every day at school either for pleasure, as a whole class or one-to one.
- Developing a love of reading reading books going home should be easy!
- Should be reading at home to an adult at least three times a week, but daily if possible! Developing understanding of what has been read.
- Please write in the Reading Record book when your child has read.
 Read and ask questions to help check their understanding.

Look at the pictures.



Hop, Skip and Jump

Read to the end and come back.





Mouse the Mouth

Say the first sound.



Try on the Fly!

Try a word that makes sense.



Say each sound.



Slide the Snake

Blend the sounds together.





Chunky Monkey

Look for chunks.



Tommy Tracker

Point to each word as you read.



Use your memory.

Where have you seen the word before?

Flippy Dolphin

Flip the vowel from short to long.





Reading books


- Please ensure reading books are in school every day.
- Reading books will be changed weekly if they have been read with 95% fluency and understanding.
- Flexibility to change books more regularly through the week once we have settled into routines.
- Adults MUST sign and make a note to confirm that child has completed and understood so that children can change books.
- Rhino reading books online.


Put the reading book and record into the white box next to the door. An adult will check this everyday and change whatever books are in it.



Home learning

- Tasks will be set on Google Classroom with instructions.
 Paper copies of the tasks will be placed in the homework book.
- Initially phonics task, mini book and e book, small maths game.
- Set on a Friday Hand in books in on Tuesday.
- If homework is not handed in then we will spend playtime completing it.

SATS

This year all the children will sit a SATS Test on Reading, Maths Arithmetic and Maths Reasoning. There is a spelling and grammar paper, but these aren't compulsory, so I don't do them!

These are nothing at all to worry about, they are more a check up on the school and won't stop your child becoming Prime Minister if they scored zero!

All the small things we are sending home each week are to help consolidate all the learning we are doing in class, having it drip fed little and often will help prepare the children for the SATS to show off everything they have learnt up to that point. It is also a great way of us knowing if they understood something (so if they take it home and have no idea – let us know!) but overall, they are just a week we eat lots of biscuits and enjoy!
