








WHY IS TRANSITION SO IMPORTANT FOR YOUR CHILD?



Transition: A process not an event



Each child is different and some may take a little longer to settle

Our transition processes are based on the best interests and needs of your child





We will work with you to help your child to settle and be confident in their new surroundings





GETTING TO KNOW YOU AND YOUR CHILD



We will do this by:

- Parent and Teacher Teams meetings
- Transition for each child carefully planned with you and the class teacher
- Pre-school visits
- Stay and play sessions
- Small group nursery session
- Opportunities to ask questions and share concerns

HOW DOES MY CHILD LEARN?

CHARACTERISTICS OF EFFECTIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING



Three characteristics of effective teaching and learning are:

- playing and exploring children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'
- active learning children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements
- creating and thinking critically children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things

HOW CAN I SUPPORT MY CHILD AT HOME?





Communicate and talk with your child



Enjoy physical activities together



Have fun exploring maths



Read, tell and make up stories together



Support your child to do things by themselves



Encourage your child to talk and play with others







What to Bring

At the beginning of term

Wellies and bag of spare labelled clothes (to stay in school)

Each day

- Named water bottle (avoid metal ones)
- Book bag (with small key ring attached)
- Coat
- Gloves and warm hat in winter
- Sun hat in the summer
 To toys or food from home







What to Do

Before the beginning of term

- Purchase uniform, book bag, water bottle, drawstring bag for spare clothes, wellies
- Order milk for your child

Each day

- Ensure your child has the correct things
- Arrive on time to drop your child off and collect them at the end (8:50-11:50)
- Check tapestry for messages
